

Summer 2012 Scholarship and Financial Aid Information

All students (visiting and NYU) should first submit the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#) to be evaluated for financial aid at New York University. Enter the NYU federal school code 002785 on the FAFSA to transmit the information to NYU. Submit the FAFSA before you submit the Summer Financial Aid Application.

IMPORTANT:

- If you attended a NYU summer session last year (summer 2011) and received financial aid during that period, you must complete the [2012-2013 FAFSA](#) if you have not already done so to be evaluated for summer 2012.
- If you DID NOT attend a NYU summer session last year (summer 2011), you must complete the [2011-2012 FAFSA](#) if you have not already done so to be evaluated for summer 2012.

Students will be awarded their financial aid online via [NYU Albert](#). An email with the appropriate link will be sent to your NYU email account once your financial aid award package is available (awarding for summer begins in late March). Information about how to secure your aid will be provided in your financial aid award package. All communication regarding your summer financial aid will be available to you via "self service" on [NYU Albert](#).

1. [NYU SCHOLARSHIP](#).

The priority deadline to submit this form is **MAY 1, 2012**.

IMPORTANT: The May 1 deadline and scholarship eligibility criteria described below do not apply to students enrolled in the Paul McGhee Division of SCPS. Students in the McGhee program are automatically reviewed for scholarship eligibility. The May 1 deadline also does not apply to certain programs at Tisch School of the Arts (the 3-year dance program, and transfer students to Tisch Film/TV & Recorded Music whose first semester is summer 2012) or if you will be a Junior in the accelerated Nursing program in summer 2012.

All applicants are evaluated for summer scholarship funding when submitting this form. To be eligible for summer scholarship at NYU, you must:

- Enroll at least half-time (6 points) over summer sessions I and II. (If you enroll for fewer credits than you indicate on this form, your scholarship eligibility will be adjusted accordingly.)
- Be a matriculated NYU undergraduate student. (If you are a special or visiting student, and wish to be considered for scholarship you may wish to review the [Summer Aid Application for Non-NYU \(Visiting\) Students](#).)
- Scholarship funds must be available.
- Be otherwise eligible for federal student aid.
- Have financial need, after your federal aid eligibility for summer is taken into account, based on the review by the Office of Financial Aid.
- If you are eligible, the amount of summer scholarship that you may receive is based upon your enrollment (combining enrollment in both summer sessions):

Enroll 6 to 8 points -- up to \$1,700

Enroll 9 to 11 points -- up to \$2,550

Enroll 12 points or more -- up to \$3,400

2. [FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID](#).

The priority deadline to submit this form is **JULY 20, 2012**.

- Federal Grants: Your record will be reviewed for summer grant eligibility.
- Federal Loans: Your record will be reviewed for maximum summer federal loan eligibility. You must be enrolled at least half-time (6 credits or more) to be eligible for federal loans.

As with your other aid, you will be able to view these suggested amounts on [NYU Albert](#) once you've been awarded. If federal loans are offered in your award, and you wish to pursue them, follow the specific instructions on Albert to obtain the loan funds. Please follow the instructions carefully and promptly.

Students who received their maximum Stafford loan amount for the spring 2012 semester may not be eligible for additional Stafford loan funds in summer 2012.

3. [NEW YORK STATE GRANT](#).

The priority deadline to submit this form is **JULY 20, 2012**.

If you are a New York State resident you may be eligible for a summer [Tuition Assistance Program \(TAP\) Grant](#) if you are enrolled as a full-time student (12 credits or more). Your potential TAP grant can be determined by using the [New York State TAP Estimator](#). If you use the TAP calculator, divide the estimated one semester amount by 2 to obtain the amount for summer.

Note: Undergraduate students are limited to receive a total of eight TAP payments. If you request a summer TAP payment it will affect your grant payments in future semesters.

4. ASSISTANCE FROM OTHER SOURCES.

If you will receive tuition remission from NYU or an outside employer, or any other outside financial assistance for your summer attendance at NYU, please specify and include the number of credits covered or the dollar amount. **NOTE:** students who receive NYU tuition remission are not eligible for NYU scholarship.

5. PRIVATE (NON-FEDERAL) ALTERNATIVE LOAN.

The priority deadline to submit this form is **JULY 20, 2012.**

This may be an option for you if you are not eligible for federal aid. NYU does not endorse, recommend or prefer any particular private loan over another. Note that loan terms and eligibility requirements can vary. [Click here](#) for information about lenders that NYU students have used in the past. Students may apply for a private loan via the lender's website, and credit approval is usually necessary. Allow up to 3 weeks processing time.

1. NYU SCHOLARSHIP.

The priority deadline to submit this form is **JUNE 1, 2012.**

- Scholarships are awarded on a rolling basis while funds are available.
- You must be a visiting undergraduate student.
- Scholarships are limited to students enrolled at the Washington Square campus location.
- Enroll at least half-time (6 points) over summer sessions I and II. (If you enroll for fewer credits than you indicate on this form, your scholarship eligibility will be adjusted accordingly.)
- Have financial need for summer based on the FAFSA results and our internal award criteria. This will be reviewed and determined by the Office of Financial Aid.
- If you are eligible, the amount of summer scholarship that you may receive is further based upon your enrollment (combining enrollment in both sessions):

Enroll 6 to 8 points -- up to \$1,000

Enroll 9 to 11 points -- up to \$1,500

Enroll 12 points or more -- up to \$2,000

2. FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID (CONSORTIUM AGREEMENT).

The priority deadline to submit your consortium agreement is **JULY 20, 2012.**

If you currently receive federal financial aid at your home school, you may be able to apply a portion of it to your attendance at NYU. Please consult with your financial aid office to determine if you can complete a Consortium Agreement for New York University. (Federal

regulations permit only one institution, the "home institution," to award federal financial aid.)

Or submit by fax to 212-995-4661. Please include your NYU ID number on all faxed pages.

Keep a copy of it for your records. Please note that not all schools participate in consortium contracts, so please inquire early and plan accordingly. Please allow up to 3 weeks processing time. Include a fax number on your consortium agreement so NYU can fax the completed form back to your home school.

If your school does not participate in consortium agreements or if you are not currently enrolled at another institution, then you are not eligible for federal student aid for summer at NYU. You may consider instead a non-federal (private) alternative loan (see item 5 below) to pay the full cost of your attendance at NYU.

3. [INSTITUTIONAL SCHOLARSHIP OR GRANT FROM YOUR HOME SCHOOL.](#)

If you are receiving institutional scholarship or grant funds from your home school while you are in attendance at NYU, please indicate the total amount you will receive for the entire summer (sessions I and II).

4. [ASSISTANCE FROM OTHER SOURCES.](#)

If you will receive tuition remission from NYU or an outside employer, or any other outside financial assistance for your summer attendance at NYU, please specify and include the number of credits covered or the dollar amount.

5. [PRIVATE \(NON-FEDERAL\) ALTERNATIVE LOAN.](#)

The priority deadline to submit this form is **JULY 20, 2012.**

This may be an option for you if you are not eligible for federal aid or if your school does not participate in consortium agreements.
